Concept map and PBLs	12-09-2023	<p>The aims of the workshop were:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) Let the faculty be trained about the conduct and process of the PBLs process and b) To uplift the standards of the ongoing PBLs in perspective of concept mapping on the analogy of the University of Glasgow, UK. <p>Concept mapping promotes deep learning and therefore we focused this aspect to improve the problem-solving skills of students through efficient involvement of the faculty members who conduct the PBLs. More, assessment blueprinting gives a fair chance for assessment, which is one the basic principles of assessment.</p> <p>All course coordinators and course organizers are the target audience to do curricular blueprinting.
